PASTORAL NOTES

ia ora! Welcome to our worship this morning. If you are a first-time guest, I encourage you to fill out a blue visitor card and hand it to the welcomers or drop it in one of the offering bags.

A core area where I want to see growth here at PBC is our ministry to children, youth and young families. I thank God for the young families currently attending – including my own family. We don't have many, but I know God will bring the increase. Praise God for our ongoing ministries to children (Sunday Friends) and youth (Breakthrough). Prayer and practical help are needed in these ministries. Don't

hesitate to speak with Guan and Mary to know where help is needed.

In the latest issue of the Baptist Magazine, Craiq Vernall wrote an article titled "One Decision or 52?" which has encouraged me to be faithful in taking my children to the church worship as this will have a positive impact on them. Vernall writes: "Reducing family church attendance to a minimum is a recipe for heartache. I've had a number of ... conversations with parents of young adults who have left the faith. It's a hard conversation to have with a parent when I point out an obvious reason: for the child, church and Jesus are synonymous. Avoid one and you're diminishing the value of the other." The point is not mere church attendance; in fact in some cases a merely ritualistic church attendance can have negative effects on the child. The point is the sincerity and fervor of our faith in Christ which shows itself in our prioritisation of the regular disciplines of grace such as prayer, corporate worship, etc., and this I believe will have a positive impact on our children's journey to true faith.

This morning we're continuing our look at the armour of God in Ephesians 6, and we're looking today at the sandals of the gospel of peace. I trust this message will help equip you for the Christian life.

PRAY FOR THE PERSECUTED CHURCH IN ZIMBABWE

fter 37 years in office, President Robert Mugabe surrendered power in November 2017, following a peaceful "coup" by Zimbabwe's army and pressure from his political party.

Mugabe had included Christians amongst his targets for repression. Religious gatherings critical of his government were categorised as political events; hence, public Christian events such as prayer rallies were monitored.

"I'm just about to finish preaching and I'm told the police are waiting outside," said Pastor Evan Mawarire to his shocked congregation, shortly before he was arrested in September last year. In spite of the constitution guaranteeing religious freedom and freedom of expression, Christian leaders, churches, and religiously-affiliated Non-Government

Organisations (NGOs) perceived to disagree with the former president were harassed.

Later that month, Mawarire was acquitted for the second time of attempting to subvert the government. Immediately after, he was hit with a new charge of promoting violence. His "This Flag" movement inspired large-scale protests against the former president's totalitarian rule. Its call for justice to be restored in the country resonated with the country's 85% Christian population. He was only one of many brave Christian leaders speaking up for justice in Zimbabwe.

Zimbabwe is still recovering from the ravages of the 2015–2016 drought, which was its worst in living memory. Although last year saw improved rains, the April–May harvests were not universally plentiful, due to flooding and other problems. [A Christian organisation] has provided maize meal, seeds and fertiliser, and also funds training in a Christian-inspired farming method that can give good yields even in drought conditions.

Entreat the Lord that Zimbabwe's new leadership will fear God (Exodus 18:21), and respect religious freedom. Join hands with our Zimbabwean brothers and sisters, and cry to the Lord with "a faith that can move mountains" (1 Corinthians 13:2) for the recent drought to remain a thing of the past. Praise the Lord for the courage of his servants, who speak the truth to authority and are persecuted for it. Pray that they will not be discouraged, but continue to live in and speak the truth.
