A Lesson from the Migrating Geese

There is a very good reason why migrating geese fly in "V" formation. Each goose flapping its wings creates an upward lift for the goose that follows. When all the geese do their part, the whole flock has a 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew it lone. Also when a goose begins to lag behind, the others "honk" it into position. The spiritual applications here are tremendous. A Christian will also find life easier "flying in the flock" instead of flying alone.



I Peter 5.8–9: "Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith, because you know that the family of believers throughout the world is undergoing the same kind of sufferings."

Jack Wellman says of this passage: "Peter is addressing ... being sober or serious-minded because we have an archenemy, the devil, who is like a lion in the wild. Satan is roaming or prowling about, crouching and hiding, ready to spring upon any of us in an instant. Who are the most vulnerable? It is those who are separated from the flock and the ones who are hurting from the sufferings that we all endure in our Christian walk. The flock, which is overseen by the Great Shepherd, Jesus Christ, is the only place that provides safety and protection and this protection is critical because Satan is 'seeking someone to devour' right now ... The Christian life is not a solo act but must be one in which we are growing together, praying for one another, and encouraging one another ... We can resist him if we remain 'firm in the faith' and this standing firm comes from the knowledge 'that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your' brothers and sisters 'throughout the world.' That is, you are not alone in this but in very good company."

Days and weeks merge into one.


Everything is eerily quiet,

Mission Updates from Kim & Mary Robertson (May 2020)

NZ & Thailand Flattened the Curve: Thailand has been similar to NZ, significantly lessening restrictions on 17 May.

Don Chedi Believers: We are in contact with most of the believers by phone, although some have been difficult to keep in touch with. Pastor Bird has been videoing Sunday & mid-week messages for them but not all are able to access these. Pray that they will keep pressing into Jesus and stand firm in their faith in Him.



Zume Discipleship Training Online: Will Brooks, one of our CT Team, has started an online discipleship training group called Zume (Zume means yeast in Greek). The course is to train believers to make disciples who will make disciples ... There are six Thai Christian leaders and two missionaries (including Mary) participating in this 10-week training of 2 hours online every Thursday. At the end, each one is to hopefully start their own group. During a time when we can't get out, this is a way to encourage and equip believers to grow in their faith and to disciple others in a way that will keep going. Will is making for extraordinary prayer to get this going.

New Members for our Central Thailand Team: Phil & Julie & Sophie (2.5 years old) from USA, who will be joining the CT Team mid-June, will be placed with a young church in Lopburi and also have some

involvement with prison ministry. Pray for them as they prepare and adjust. They are expecting a second child in November.

Praise God for: (1) NZ & Thailand both doing well in "flattening the curve"! (2) Pastor Bird live streaming & videoing church services for Suphanburi Samphan Church & Don Chedi Church; (3) Harng & Vung after a long delay moving to their placement in Singburi 4 May; (4) Phil & Judie, a good placement worked out with a young church in Lopburi; and (5) family news: Anna & Andre expecting their second baby in September.

Pray to God for: (1) Zume Discipleship Training online course started, running every Thursday for 10 weeks; (2) Emanuel & Barbara still in Switzerland with their three children in Thailand. Hoping to fly here in July; (3) OMF Central Thailand Team: as we ease back into face-to-face ministry and for families with children to adapt to the new normal; (4) Wanpen & Wit (25kms away) and Bu & Lek & family (6kms out of Don Chedi) - that their faith would grow despite no cell groups or visiting; and (5) all missionaries' financial support in shaking times.

Updates from NZ Baptist Missionary Society (21st May)

Cyclone Amphan: Originating in the Bay of Bengal, Cyclone Amphan made landfall in West Bengal on Wednesday afternoon, local time. The devastating impact of the cyclone has meant millions of people have been displaced from their homes in West Bengal and Bangladesh; thousands have lost their homes completely, and many more are faced with homes damaged by major flooding or wind damage. At least six of the women who work at Freeset have lost the roofs of their houses.



Please pray:

- That the millions who have been evacuated will be kept safe from the storm, particularly as they travel to seek refuge.
- For the Lord's hand of protection to be over the people of West Bengal. May they be protected from any further devastation.
- Give thanks that the damage in Bangladesh was not as bad as feared. However, we can expect that storm surges and flooding over the next few days will bring more hardship and damage.
- That local churches will be strengthened at this time, and will know how best to serve their communities.
- Those we have sent, and the communities they serve. May they draw close to God during this time, and trust in His protection and provision.
