SOUTH ASIA: WHY WE WORK THERE

This is part 2 of our current focus on work of NZBMS* in South Asia. We're featuring it here as part of our ongoing Prayer & Self-Denial. Last week we featured India. As of October 2018, India's



total population was 1,347,830,000. About 94.6% of that (1,274,692,000) are unreached.

As we come to the second week of the Self-Denial we focus on the work of NZBMS in Bangladesh. As of October 2018, Bangladesh has 165.615.000 population. 98.8% of whom are unreached. Our Tranzsend* staff work in two localities within this country. Education is highly prized in many of the communities we work in, as a long term solution for freeing families from poverty. We run two community schools which offer an English-based education in a God-honouring environment.

Christians are very much minorities in the areas where we work, making up less than 1% of the population. Many local church leaders believe the best way the Church in New Zealand can support them is by helping train and support local Christians. Tranzsend staff provide theological training to both pastors and lay people, and mentorship of church leaders who would otherwise be under-resourced.

THE STUDENT

he youngest of six – one of the only two girls – born into a poor family, this young lady has not had the easiest life. Being sponsored to come to GEMS changed that life and impacted her family.

As teachers, we sometimes complained about this student's frequent absences from school and her low ability. What we didn't realise was that her family often kept her away insisting she help other family members. Her family didn't understand the importance of her attending school, believing she could be of more use at home.

When she was in Class 8, she completed a leadership course and everything changed. She set a goal to attend school every day. Keeping that goal meant having to stand up to her family, but she did it. Since then, she has gone from strength to strength (although she still struggles with maths!) and her family have slowly changed their minds about their daughter's schooling. They now encourage her and even excuse her from household

chores so she can focus on study. For a family like this, this is a huge step.

Our student is currently preparing for October's O-Level exams, the highest schooling any person in her family has ever achieved. Her aim is to make the most of the opportunity she's been given to not only help her family, but also to help her country. She has a dream of becoming a nurse, and dreams of providing some health service in schools to encourage other girls to have the courage to stand up and take their studies seriously.

It's been such an immense privilege to be a part of this young woman's life and journey a little while with her. Please join me in praying for her future and all she achieves.
