## **PASTORAL NOTES**

jou are a first-time guest, I encourage you to fill out a blue visitor card and hand it to the welcomers or drop it in one of the offering bags.

This past week God gave me the following words from James 5:13–16: "Are any of you suffering hardships? You should pray. Are any of you happy? You should sing praises. Are any of you sick? You should call for the elders of the church to come and pray over you, anointing you with oil in the name of the Lord. Such a prayer offered in faith will heal the sick, and the Lord will make you well. And if you have

committed any sins, you will be forgiven. Confess yours sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The earnest prayer of a righteous person has great power and produces wonderful results."

Keep praying for Jan Shapcott's sister Julie in Brisbane, whose health condition is getting worse. Pray also for those in our community who are ill, in pain, lonely or sorrowing.

I was filled with joy this past Friday when I took the time to visit some of the homes surrounding our church. Together with a member from our Church I knocked on 13 homes. In 9 of these homes our calls were unanswered; apparently the residents were away. But we were able to greet and speak with 4 residents, and that experience was priceless! None of them rudely turned us away. All of them gave us a bit of their time, and although all of them refused our offer of prayer, they did so politely. The best case was the last person we spoke with, who spoke with us for about 5 minutes. I'm sure she was appreciative of our friendly visit; she no signs of being annoyed.

I'll be doing more of this community engagement visits. Pray that it will be fruitful. We are a church without walls, aren't we? If we proactively reach out to our community, we'll be able to achieve more results for God's Kingdom.

This morning we come to Eph 5:21–33, where Paul, inspired by God's Spirit, talks about God's design for marriage. Paul says the husband-wife relationship mirrors the relationship between Christ and His church. This analogy immediately rules out abuse, domination, subjection, etc in husband-wife relationship. It immediately foregrounds the centrality of love, mutual respect, cooperation, sacrifice, etc. But as we shall see the distinctions in the roles of husbands and wives remain and must be observed.

First, Paul begins with *mutual submission* (v. 21) which qualifies his ensuing instructions. Mutual submission is a general principle not confined to husband-wife relationship. Second, Paul says the wife is to submit to her husband, who is her head – just as the church submits to Christ, her Head (v. 22). Not that the wife is inferior to the husband. They are equal in every way but possess varying (but complementary) roles. Paul affirms the loving headship (leadership) of husbands in marriage and the loving submission and cooperation of the wife. Third, the husband is to love

his wife as Christ loved the church. Now we see what husband's headship is. It's not domination or forcible rule but loving service. Christ loved the church so much He died for her. Husbands need to follow the Lord's example. But the mutuality in v. 21 implies that the wife is to love her husband too.

# PRAY FOR THE PERSECUTED CHURCH IN TANZANIA

anzania's population is 60% Christian and 36% Muslim, with the mainland predominantly Christian, and the semi-autonomous Zanzibar archipelago 98% Muslim. Previously known in Africa for religious tolerance, Tanzania is now a place where Christians in Muslim-majority areas are finding life increasingly difficult.

Muslims disproportionately influence the country, having many senior positions in government, judiciary, business and education. Some are pressuring the government to introduce *khadi* (Islamic courts) on the Christian-majority mainland, following Zanzibar, although the process has stalled.

Muslims have customarily slaughtered animals to ensure the meat is halal, but now assume it is their exclusive right. Local authorities are pressured to arrest Christians who slaughter their own animals and sell pork, despite it not being illegal. In areas where local authorities have not yielded to pressure, Christian butchers are attacked, some killed. Their customers are also assaulted.

Violent Islamist attacks are growing, especially against converts from Islam and church leaders both in the mainland and in Zanzibar. On Zanzibar's island of Pemba, churches have needed constant police protection from arsonists, and many Christians have fled to the mainland.

President John Magufuli – a Christian – is trying to assert Tanzania's secular nature with equal freedoms for all religions, and last year the Mufti of Tanzania condemned attacks on Christians.

Tanzania's constitution enshrines freedom of religion, including the freedom to convert, and prohibits religious discrimination. Zanzibar's constitution enshrines this, but allows limits if deemed "necessary

and agreeable in the democratic system," potentially allowing such freedoms to be over-ridden at the desire of the Muslim majority.

Pray to God to protect our persecuted Tanzanian brothers and sisters, and for them to be comforted by the words of Christ: "Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 5:10). Ask that they will be given wisdom from above to respond to the developing situation in their country.
